Background

- This area was named after Phillip Williamson who bequeathed the land to the Thames-Coromandel District Council in 1929.
- This reserve is a very popular visitor destination, as the summer festivals are held in this area, with a pavilion being developed on the reserve to accommodate this and other events.
- The surf club have a club room building and accommodation building with storage underneath in the northern area of the reserve adjacent to the main beach access.

Reserve Issues

- The large pines that are a landscape feature of this reserve are coming to the end of their life.
- A stormwater overflow pond is located behind the beach dunes, providing for the soakage of stormwater from the surrounding area.
- Banksia trees along the road edge have been planted underneath the power lines and require removal and planting with alternative species.

Reserve Management Policy

- 1. Allow for Council approved events.
- 2. All public events are to abide by the Council's Acoustic Management Plan (refer Appendix 1) Propose six consecutive days over Christmas/New Year holiday. All applications outside the specific period will be subject to approval by Council.
- 3. Liaise with Surf club over beach access and maintenance of the reserve land surrounding their building.
- 4. Monitor the stormwater pond issues.
- 5. Maintain beachfront reserves where possible in a natural state.
- 6. Prohibit encroachment from adjoining properties onto the recreation and esplanade reserves.
- 7. Protect and enhance the reserve area through planting of coastal species and controlling access through the dune area.
- 8. Develop a plan for succession planting of pine trees.
- 9. Reserve objectives and policies as outlined in Document 1 apply.
